




WE DEMAND

Developed countries:

to fulfil their historical responsibility and provide adequate and predictable finance, technology transfer, and capacity building to support adaptation, mitigation, and loss and damage in pushing for grant-based funding

to Sustain our position on the rejection of the promotion of Carbon Markets that are not responsive and do not serve the climate justice imperatives for Africa. We further urge for continued dialogue in the spirit of closing knowledge gaps on Carbon Markets that are apparent, at all levels.

We urge African Leaders:

to stand by the principles of climate justice, human rights, gender equality, and intergenerational equity in all climate policies and actions

to a just and equitable transition to renewable energy, ensuring that energy marginalised and that community ownership and participation quaranteed.
